At *Together* we love, we adore people who inspire others, and sometimes those people – in the earthly sense – are taken from us but when their presence is so powerful it seems like they're... still hanging around. I was devastated this week to hear about the passing of – an old cliché that fits this time – a legend, not just for my team Celtic but for lots of folks who know their football across Europe and beyond.

What did he do? As an imperious captain he led Celtic, under the (man)management of the mighty Jock Stein, to nine league titles in a row. He played 822 times for the club he loved, the club he joined as a very young man, and he came back twice as manager to wine four further league titles in our hour of need.

But he transcended football – he applied his knowledge and his warmth across the board, everybody was welcome. It was fitting that three days before he died Athletic Club Bilbao awarded him the 'One Club Man' for his lifelong dedication to Celtic. Athletic Club Bilbao have a Basque region only policy in the signing of players – McNeill captained Celtic to a European Cup final win in 1967 against the guys with all the money. The Celtic players were all born within 30-odd kilometres of Celtic Park – and they annihilated Inter Milan. All this was improbably possible under the leadership pf someone who came be known as 'Cesar'. Not after the Roman Emperor but after Cesar Romero the actor with whom he shared the car model in the original film *Ocean's Eleven*.

I posted on Facebook that there were not just enough words to describe the man, except just to say that Cesar was a *mensch*. Thanks, big man...



A New Dynamic for Autism

Brussels-based Autism-Europe talks about the latest initiative to help those suffering from autism

urope counts an estimated 7.4 million people on the autism spectrum (1% of the population according to prevalence studies). This is more than the entire population of Bulgaria. Autism is therefore by no means a rare condition. However, the diversity of the spectrum and the fact it is a largely invisible condition means that it can be quite easy to overlook the difficulties experienced by autistic people.

Autism is complex lifelong disability. People on the autism spectrum experience persistent difficulties with social communication and social interaction, and might display restricted and repetitive patterns of behaviours, activities or interests.

Although they might not always be obvious, the barriers they and their families find themselves confronted with are numerous. In all EU countries, at varying levels, they have similar difficulties in accessing a diagnosis, inclusive education adapted to their needs, employment, person-centred and life-long support, and lack services to assist them in moments of transition throughout their lifespan. As a result, many people on the autism spectrum are deprived of the right to eniov life in the community.

Since 1983, the international organization Autism-Europe (AE) has been advancing the rights of autistic people and their families and helping them improve their quality of life. Based in Brussels, AE ensures effective liaison among 90-member autism organisations in 38 European countries, including 28 member states of the EU, governments and European and international institutions. In order to respond to the daily challenges autistic people face, each year AE conducts Europe-wide awareness raising campaign. In 2019, the motto is 'A New



Dynamic for Autism. I ∞ autism'.

AE encourages individuals, families, groups, companies or associations to post pictures of them doing the infinity gesture on social media using the hashtag #AutismDay2019, together with an explanation of what kind of action they take to support an inclusive society for autistic people. The infinity symbol, which symbolizes neurodiversity, strength and unity. This year, the campaign is also closely linked to the objectives of Autism-Europe's 12th International Congress. taking place in Nice (France) in September 2019 and expecting more than 1,5K participants.

There are many ways to support AE and improve the quality of life of people on the autism spectrum. You can become a (individual) member, make a donation, fundraise on behalf of AE, subscribe to its biannual magazine LINK, sponsor AE on behalf of a business, or even volunteer and use your skills to contribute to its work.

4-7-8 breathing: The simple formula

Kate Cracknell offers a few reminders of how we should breathe properly

ver the years, you've probably forgotten how to breathe properly. But it's easy to re-learn this vital skill, and the benefits are significant - from "THE LUNGS

improved productivity at work to enhanced sleep.

You probably think you know how to breathe.

Actually, more to the point, you most likely have never given it much

thought - it's just something your body does naturally, automatically, without having to think about it.

But therein lies the problem.


Because in fact, it would do us all good to

pay more attention to our breathing. Here's why...

1 - It makes you more productive at work

Breathing properly improves your levels of focus and productivity at work.

Stress is one of the biggest contributors to illness and absenteeism among employees; it's been estimated to cost the US economy \$300 billion per year. And even if you aren't off

work as a result, stress is something that affects all of us – and that unquestionably impacts our ability to focus and think creatively.

But there is a simple solution. Deep breathing has been shown to have a significant, positive impact on our ability to deal with stress.



Let's take a step back.

As babies, we naturally breathe abdominally – that is, breathing in such a way that our belly goes in and out. This deep breathing is very relaxing. However, the way we breathe tends to change as we get older. We start to shallow breathe, and that's because the short, fast breaths we associate with feeling scared are also

brought on by stress.

The problem is, extended periods of stress result in us always breathing like this – it's as if our bodies un-learn how to breathe naturally. We end up only ever breathing into the top third of our lungs. The result? We aren't

getting the oxygen we need to keep our brains and bodies firing optimally.

Once these bad habits are ingrained, you have to consciously reverse them, teaching your body how to breathe again.

How do you do that? Simple. When you're

sitting at your desk, every hour or two, take a moment to focus on your breathing. Take 10 slow, deep breaths right into your belly, so it expands when you breathe in; if in doubt, put your hand on your belly to feel it move. Breathe in through your nose and out through your mouth.

One top tip: if you find yourself sighing while

If you've been sitting at your desk, it often means you've been breathing incorrectly; this is a great time to take 10 of your deep, slow, abdominal breaths.

Over time, your body will re-learn how to breathe – and you'll find you're less stressed, more productive and more energised.

2 - It helps you sleep

There are, in fact, plenty of techniques designed to help us breathe deeply. Another technique, developed by sleep specialist Dr Andrew Weil, includes an element of breath-holding. Known as the 4-7-8 method, it's designed to calm the mind, relax the muscles and help us get to sleep.



The technique works as follows:

- 1. Breathe in through your nose for a count of four; feel your belly expanding.
- 2. Hold that breath for a count of seven.
- 3. Blow out through your mouth for a slow count of eight. Ideally you should put your tongue behind your teeth, so you make a whooshing sound as you exhale.

This method is based on a yoga technique – Pranayama – and it works, says Weil, because the lungs become fully charged with air and bring more oxygen into the body. In turn, this promotes a state of mental and physical calm.

Once again, it comes down to the amazing ability of deep breathing to expel stress from our bodies. In this case, though, rather than helping us focus at work, the benefit is enhanced sleep: the 4-7-8 technique is said to help us fall asleep in a shorter period of

time, and even sleep longer through the night.

3 - You'll get more from your workouts

Focusing on breathing while you exercise is also important, and not only in classes like yoga and Pilates where it's emphasized throughout every move. Indeed, adopting the correct breathing techniques can ensure you get the best results from every workout you do



Rewrite your history and unblock your potential

Anna Boroshok looks at two case studies that will give you hope that you can turn things around



do I always attract emotionally unavailable partners? Why do I push away people who are dear to me? Why do I shut down when people criticize me?

If any of these questions ever tortured you, good news! You are limited by your harmful past and you can rewrite it. Before we go into 'how', let me explain to you how it works.

When we are children and experience traumas, we develop protective mechanisms and turn them into habits which then limit us all throughout our adult life. We also learn the model of relationships from our parents because this is the only reality we live in for

many years. Even though the relationships were dysfunctional, we will unconsciously attract partners who recreate those dysfunctional relationships or we will spoil the relationships by ourselves (unwillingly, of course) rebuilding the model of relationships we witnessed during our childhood.

Let me tell you two stories to give you a better understanding on how it works.

Story Number 1

Meet Ella. She is a 35-year-old web designer and has trouble making her opinion heard both at work and in her personal life. In fact, every time she thinks she needs to speak up. she cannot because she thinks that her

opinion is not valuable or might be wrong. This prevents Ella from growing her career and building balanced loving relationships where she can freely express herself and be heard by a partner.

Let us have a look at why this happens to Ella. When she was a kid, her father criticised her for her opinions: shouted at her when she could not complete home work as per his expectations: and he did not allow her to

express her opinion in front of adults. As a child, Ella developed a protective mechanism of shutting down and being silent. She learned to keep her opinion to herself which now affects her adult life. At work she is not able to express her ideas and agrees with opinions with others even though she does not like them. This makes her feel bad about herself and makes her a mediocre employee with no opinion and no possibility to grow. In her personal

relationships she is also not speaking out about accumulating negative feelings and emotions which eventually bring the relationships to an end.

" WE CAN REWRITE OUR STORIES"

Is there anything Ella can do about her harmful patterns and protective behaviours she has developed as a child? She definitely can. First of all, she needs to look into her past to identify those moments when she had developed her protective mechanisms. She will also need to forgive her father for behaving in such a harmful way as he was acting out of his own traumas and limitations. Finally, she will need to become aware of her protective mechanisms in her daily life and start breaking them. For example, she could start speaking out at work and express her ideas; she could start working on her



confidence by reading relevant books and taking relevant personal development courses.

In her personal life, she could talk openly to her partner and explain what she experienced as a child and how it prevents her from speaking out about what troubles her in the adult life. Then, she could express her concerns about what makes her feel bad and good in relationships and think together

with a partner how they can both work on making these relationships a better place for both of them.

Story Number 2

Meet Anna. She is 30 vears old and has just

divorced her husband she spent seven years with. Anna has filed for divorce because she felt her husband was not emotionally available to her so she cheated on him because she was missing his attention and love.

After the divorce Anna has continued meeting guvs who did not want or were not ready to build loving and meaningful relationships with her. However, when there was a nice loving guy appearing on her horizon, she would push him away. Let us

have a look at her past to understand why. When Anna was a child, she was craving her father's love because she felt he was not there for her. He was always coming home late, did not spend time with her, and did not show her any affection. When she was 11 vears old, she saw him cheating on her mother with another woman. Then, he left her and her mother for another family.

What has Anna learned from this experience as a child? She has concluded that she is not worthy of love; that to be loved, she always needs to prove herself to someone by being very nice and doing the best for a partner - in other words, buying her partner's love instead of just being who she is and receiving love without any trading.

Even though consciously Anna did not want to attract a partner like her father, that is exactly what she was doing unconsciously. On top of that.

desperately trying to win the partner's heart, she would overdo things for him, pushing him even further away. Remembering that her father was a cheater, she was also trying to control where her partners go and who they talk to. This was putting a lot of pressure on relationships and

eventually destroy them.

Additionally, Anna has developed a pattern of a 'strong' woman. Because she was abandoned by her father, she decided for herself that she will do everything to be independent and cold-hearted so she would always be ready for the unexpected: to be abandoned. This was not allowing her to relax in relationships, to show her vulnerabilities and connect with a partner on a deeper level.

Seems like Anna has developed a robust and complex set of harmful patterns and

behaviours. But even this story can be rewritten. Let us have a look how.

To break through her harmful story. Anna will need to become an adult, because until now she was living according to the protective mechanisms she has developed as a child and she was still behaving as that scared, abandoned child from her past. Once she becomes aware of how the childhood traumas affect her present, she steps into her adult life where she is able to recognize her harmful patterns, break them and create a new story. Here is how it could work for Anna:

ome Love, Some Pain, Sometime: Joan Cooper was an American playwright and author known by her pen name. J. California Cooper. She wrote 17 plays and was named Black Playwright of the Year in 1978 for her play Strangers. It was at the encouragement of Alice Walker that Cooper turned from her claim to fame in the theatre and started writing short stories. Her first collection A Piece of Mine was published in 1984. Two other story collections followed, before the release of her first novel. Family. in 1991. Cooper wrote Funny Valentines, which later was turned into a 1999 TV movie starring Alfre Woodard and Loretta Devine.

Awards Cooper won include the American Book Award (for her 1986 short-story collection *Homemade Love*), a James Baldwin Writing Award and a Literary Lion Award from the American Library Association.

Whether through her stories or her legendary readings, J. California Cooper has an uncanny ability to reach out to readers like an old and dear friend. Her characters are plain-spoken and direct: simple people for whom life, despite its ever-present struggles, is always worth the journey.

In Some Love, Some Pain, Sometime,
Cooper's characteristic themes of romance,
heartbreak, struggle and faith resonate. We
meet Darlin, a self-proclaimed femme fatale
who uses her wiles to try to find a husband;
MLee, whose life seems to be coming to an
end at the age of forty until she decides to

each other; and Aberdeen, whose daughter



Toni Morrison is an American novelist, essayist, editor, teacher and professor emeritus at Princeton University.

Morrison won the Pulitzer Prize and the American Book Award in 1988 for Beloved (1987). The novel was adapted into a film of the same name (starring Oprah Winfrey and Danny Glover) in 1998. Morrison was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1993. In 1996, the National Endowment for the Humanities selected her for the Jefferson Lecture, the U.S. federal government's highest honour for achievement in the humanities. She was honoured with the 1996 National Book Foundation's Medal of Distinguished Contribution to American Letters, Morrison wrote the libretto for a new opera. Margaret Garner, first performed in 2005. On May 29, 2012. President Barack Obama presented Morrison with the Presidential Medal of Freedom, In 2016, she received the PEN/Saul Bellow Award for Achievement in American Fiction.

Morrison's spellbinding novel is a Faulknerian symphony of passion and hatred, power and perversity, colour and class that spans three generations of black women in a fading beach town. In life, Bill Cosey enjoyed the affections of many women, who would do almost anything to gain his favour. In death his hold on them may be even stronger. Wife, daughter, granddaughter, employee, mistress: As Morrison's protagonists stake their furious claim on Cosey's memory and estate, using everything from intrigue to outright violence, she creates a work that is shrewd, funny, erotic, and heart wrenching.

Making sense of the markets

Dave Deruytter leads you through the maze of the world's financial markets



low economic growth and high earnings are keeping the financial markets in check. Interest rates are forecasted to stay low in the near future and will offer support to stock prices.

Equity markets are always correctly priced at any given time, balancing offer and demand. Nobody has a crystal ball to predict the future. Still, we all want to make sense of the current levels of the financial markets and have a view on their future performance.

The pace of economic growth in most of the countries around the world is slowing down. China aims for just over 6% in economic

growth, the lowest in decades. The US economy is decelerating, leading to about 2% economic growth this year. The European economies lead the slower growth group. Some EU countries have a hard time to even grow their economy at 1%.

Next to economic growth, earnings, particularly future earnings, are another favourite indicator of investors. The current earnings of quite a few stocks are already on the high side. One can doubt the capacity of companies to deliver even more earnings per share.

Eventually comes the question of the



potential of the alternatives to shares for investment, bonds and real estate on top.

If the economic growth of the large countries decelerates, and official interest rates stay low, bonds may have a period of strong performance, but only

because of potential capital gains, not because of the coupons they pay.

Real estate? Yes, of course, it always is an interesting alternative. but aren't prices already really high in many markets? Is the US

housing market getting into dangerous territory again, because of over-borrowing by people? To diversify your real estate assets, mutual funds or companies that invest themselves in real estate, are an option to

consider. Because of very low interest rates. cash is not a real investment alternative today, unless as a safe haven, but that is costly. In most of the EU you do not get enough interest on savings accounts to cover for inflation. Thus, part of your capital

invested in cash is eaten away by inflation. Gold is another asset investors turn to when they are not sure about the outlook of the financial markets. Gold essentially is a raw material, an asset with only potential for capital gain, yet no dividend or interest income.

days, Plus, if you find them, there must be a reason why they have to offer a higher dividend, interest or rent income than the average of the market. There is no extra income return without any risk.

Politics are influencing the financial markets too. The Brexit saga is lingering on, keeping the bulls at bay. On the international

trade front there could be a deal in the making between the US and China, but that news has been around for a few months now, and apparently without a conclusion nearby. No surprise that quite a few investors are sidelined, though we saw a small bull run on the stock markets so far this year, mainly because of a lack of alternatives.

If people would put a larger part of their income into consumption rather than in investments, that should be a good thing for the worldwide economic growth. In this fast changing and challenging time with a lot of workers in burnout, shouldn't we be outsourcing more of our daily household tasks in order to balance our lives? Of course, first we should be able to afford that. For that to be the case, it is important that the wages of the middle class are high enough. If one looks at the starting wages of the young people joining the workforce today, substantially high wages are not quaranteed.

If on top of extra consumption some new big innovations could come through and create new pockets for business or new economic growth, we might be heading upwards



structurally again on the financial markets. 'Al' and 'Big Data' look promising, but the more we learn about them the further away real breakthroughs seem to be. Most realizations in both fields look more like evolutions than revolutions. Will it be 5G and the Internet of Things that will do the trick then? Maybe, but rumours have been around in those markets for quite some time now too. If there is no delivering soon, investors may see it as a false promise or again as a gradual evolution rather than a Big Bang.

The question on the mind of many investors remains whether or not we will first have a recession, or even a small or big crash on the financial markets, before heading upwards structurally again. They remember the worldwide financial and economic turmoil that started at the end of 2007 with the collapse of Lehman Brothers, plus the rebuilding of the system and trust thereafter. The financial markets could go either way when looking at the cards today. •

What is your profitability?

Our real estate expert Yannick **Callens** crunches the numbers on how to make rental income

nvesting in real estate combines security and insured benefits. By calculating the return on your real estate investments beforehand, you know what you can expect. But how exactly is the real estate vield calculated?

Before investing in real estate, you obviously want to know how much vour investment will earn vou. Investors often use

attractive rates of return. However, they often forget to say that the return they are talking about is a gross return. They simply deduct the purchase price and notary fees from the monthly rental income. In reality, the net real estate return is a few percent lower, so it is certainly necessary to take into account the various additional costs.

How to calculate the gross rent performance of a piece of real estate

The gross yield of your property is easily calculated:

Simply divide the annual rental income by the total purchase price (excluding fees).

Then multiply the result by one hundred to get the gross yield. Example:



Purchase price: €150,000 excluding fees

Rental income: €600 per month

Gross yield: $(600 \times 12)/150,000 = 4.8\%$

This rate does not correspond to actual performance. In order to get a good idea of the return on your investment, it is better to calculate the net return.

The net return takes into account the purchase price as well as all additional costs. Indeed, when buying a property, you must pay several unique fees:

- Registration Fees / T.V.A.
- Notaries' fees (also taken into account in the calculation of the gross yield)
- Deed fees
- Costs for any renovations or refurbishment

There are also various recurring annual (or monthly) fees:

- Real estate tax
- Interest on borrowed capital
- Possible maintenance costs

When calculating the yield, it is necessary to take into account all the expenses of purchase, as well as expenses equivalent to 2 months of rent per year.



Example:

Purchase price: €175,000, fees included

Rental income: €600 per month

Net return: (600 x 10) / 175,000 = 3.43%

Optimize your rental income: limit inoccupation

A vacancy is the number-one enemy of your performance. A frequent tenant change increases the risk of vacancy. Similarly, when you want to rent your property as a vacation home, monthly fixed rental income is not guaranteed. To enjoy optimal rental income, choose an investment in a new or renovated building with a good location. If, in addition, you apply for a marketbased rent, you will likely get the best return on your investment.

The leverage effect increases your return on capital invested

Mortgage interest rates remain relatively low. Therefore, for your real estate investment, it is beneficial to take advantage of financial leverage in the form of mortgage or bullet

credit. Thus, a small contribution of €75,000, for example, will allow you to invest in real estate. In addition, the financing also has a positive impact on your return, thanks to its leverage effect.

Low current borrowing rates allow you to maximize your return by financing a small portion of your investment with equity and borrowing the rest.

Real estate is a safe investment. Limited capital, an attractive loan and the tax benefits of buying real estate help ensure good returns. In order to make the most of your property, opt for a highly sought-after building on the rental market.

Real estate value continues to rise

This and That

Our tech auv Colin Moors encourages you to automate your life



ven though we spend an inordinate amount of time jabbing at the screen of our favourite phone or tablet, or clacking away on the computer keyboard there are always times we need to do something else. There are all kinds of built-in tricks to make your device do the things you want with little or no interaction - from fingerprint unlocking face scanning to lesser used functions such as setting a 'safe space' where your phone will remain unlocked at the location you specify. Of course, all these features will vary wildly depending on the make and model of the device - if only there was something you could use to automate your life online that crossed all these barriers. Well, there is.

Called If This Then That, or IFTTT, it's the one-stop shop for automation in the entire digital work and play space, and a lot more besides. The biggest selling point is the low, low price of free but also that there are literally thousands of pre-made applets for automating things - many of which may not have even occurred to you. Can you make your own applets? Yes, but that's a little beyond the scope of an article this short. A quick web search will light your way if you feel the need. Oh, and for the pedantic, it's pronounced like 'rift' without the R.

IFTTT is geared towards well-established web platforms such as Twitter, Facebook and Instagram or to wearables such as Fitbit and several phone-based fitness apps. It may



also be of interest to you if you have any of the 'connected home' gear such as Nest. Smart Things and the like. It's been wellknown in tech circles for quite some time but there seems to be a recent push to get people using it - largely because the company makes its money helping out businesses involved in automation and there has been a huge upsurge in connected apps and devices in the past few years. I blame Generation Z. Let's start with a few examples most of us will understand without explanation, then move on to the slightly

more esoteric. You will need the IFTTT app installed on your phone of choice and an account on the internet site to get the best out of it.

Have you ever lost your phone somewhere in the house? Of course, you have, If you've set up IFTTT and are near your Google Home or Alexa device, just tell it to find your phone. They'll turn up the ringer to maximum and place a call to your device. Now just follow the ring. Yes, you could ask someone to call but your phone is already lost, isn't it? Going from loud ringing to none at all, IFTTT can scan your Google calendar to see if you have a meeting. If so, it will mute your phone, allowing you to listen to Geoff from accounts run down the latest figures without

interruption. If your accounts guy is anything like ours, it can also set a vibrating alarm for five minutes before the end - then turn your speaker back on. If you've spent the entire day wondering why you aren't getting messages because your speaker was off, this is a truly fool-proof feature.

Perhaps you have trouble with your phone's Wi-Fi eating into your battery time. It's easy to forget to turn it off, meaning it will constantly search for a network, sucking the life from your phone. Just set up the applet

that will turn off your Wi-Fi say, 200 metres from your back on at the same about it, why not get it set

up so that when you are in range of your house, your automated lighting system will turn on the security light so you can see to get your key in the door?

The possibilities, while not strictly endless. are many and varied. As long as your app. device or system is supported by IFTTT, the combination of things you can achieve on a fire-and-forget basis is quite astonishing. Imagine the scenario: You are on the drive home from work. Once you reach the set distance, your Roomba stops cleaning and

goes into its house for the evening, the hall lights switch on and a tweet is sent to Pizza Hut (if it's Friday) ordering your usual preweekend Quattro Stagioni and as you walk in the door, the TV switches on and shows you the weather for tomorrow. All this is available

right now, to people with the equipment (and the money) and more apps and devices are brought in all the time.

After a little playtime you may well get addicted to automating everything (I take no responsibility) and will find you can add your current weight to your Fitbit

progress via a connected set of scales, send your Uber receipts to your expenses app or directly to a spreadsheet in the cloud or flash

the lights in your house when you get a mention on Twitter. The latter option seems unnecessarily narcissistic but hey, you're the king or queen of your automated world now.

I think my favourite idea is one of the simpler

and more elegant. You're at a party and the guy you're talking to turns out to be a nerd and won't stop talking about the latest automation technology or whatever. Your IFTTT is your knight in binary armour, reacting to a keyword in your speech or **EVERYTHING** "subtle button press while your hand is in your pocket

This time I'm voting

Catherine Feore runs the rule over the upcoming European elections



he byline of the European elections is 'This time I'm voting'. The European Parliament has set up a non-partisan platform committed to persuading people to vote in the European elections on 23-26 May 2019. They already have one hundred and fifty thousand volunteers willing to hit the street and help get that vote out.

The Parliament has slowly accrued more powers and – contrary to popular belief – enjoys real influence over legislative proposals. One could comb through its decisions and agree or disagree, but my

own verdict is that the European Parliament has been a positive force for good. It's usually pushed EU member countries to make that extra effort and be that little bit more ambitious.

The European Council's workings are still far from transparent, but the Parliament has prised open the door and, at the very least, manages to open discussions providing much-needed additional democratic oversight of the decisions of European ministers – the same ones who are ready to blame 'Brussels' for just about anything.

And yet, despite its growing might, turnout has diminished with every election. In the first direct elections in 1979 average turnout was 62%, in 2014 it was 42.6%. Interestingly, it is some of the more recent members that have the poorest turnout. In Slovakia in 2014, only 13% bothered to go to the polls. Seriously Slovakia, what's your excuse? Was it raining? The more recent members are also the principle beneficiaries of European funding. Less than a quarter of Poles made it to the polls in 2014 – this is a country that was allocated more than €100 billion from various EU funds for the 2014–2020 period.

The best in class are the Belgians, with turnout at 90%. The very simple reason for this is compulsory voting. I have mixed feelings about this approach, but the *quid pro quo* of living in a liberal democracy and having rights, is having responsibilities. Is it really too much effort to use your vote?

There's also plenty of choice in forthcoming elections. Do you hate the EU? Vote for a party that hates the EU. Do you want to see climate change given greater prominence? Vote for a green party, or a party with solid green credentials. Think that climate change is a fiction developed by a global liberal elite? Again, there's a party for you. Do you hate austerity? Or are you a disaster capitalist? Not a bother, there is a whole spectrum of parties who take different views on what the EU's economic future should look like – find the one that corresponds most closely to your views.

My message is this, love it, hate it, want to reform it, reconstruct it, rejuvenate it, destroy

it, but for goodness sake take your responsibilities as a citizen and as a voter seriously. Running around in high-visibility clothing, attacking police men and burning things is not the answer. Look at the UK, if you want to leave, you can, nobody is going to send in tanks to stop you.

Pollsters anticipate a surge in support for anti-EU and far-right parties this time around. Europe will probably have to deal with a successful Brexit Party, a sort of UKIP on steroids, led by Nigel Farage. The EU-27 will have to wait stoically for 31 October for the UK's departure – or an ever more unlikely dramatic *volte face*. It is anticipated that the centre ground will become ever more narrow and smaller factions will wield greater power. But whatever the challenges, all roads lead to dialogue and the pursuit of shared interests.

La vie en rose...

Am I a little starry-eyed about the European Parliament? Possibly, even probably.

The European Parliament has often represented the conscience of Europe, with resolutions and own opinions on everything from the plight of Rohingya refugees, to arms sales to Saudi Arabia. These resolutions may lack force, but they reflect the higher calling of our MEPs, and may be part of the longed-for tidal wave, where justice can rise up and hope and history rhyme – to borrow from Seamus Heaney.

Heaney wrote his words of hope in 1991, when peace in Northern Ireland was still a distant dream. In 1993, before the first IRA

ceasefire I was working for an MEP in Strasbourg. I was waiting for the lift one day and to my horror when the doors opened I saw that Northern Ireland's three opposing MEPs were already installed. With trepidation I stepped into the lift ready for a steely silence or worse - Ian Paisley MEP had achieved some notoriety for shouting at Pope John Paul II when he addressed the Parliament in 1988, calling him the Antichrist.

On the journey to my floor the MEPs laughed and joked and generally got on like a house on fire. When I got out of the lift I was shocked, and then I was angry. If these people could behave normally in Strasbourg, why

couldn't they behave normally in Strabane? I told a colleague about what I had witnessed, he shrugged his shoulders and said that they were famous for working well together "in Europe".

Today (26 April), a week after the murder of Northern Irish journalist Lyra McKee, killed by a member of an organization calling itself the New IRA. I think back on all that has been achieved and all that is now in danger. I think about the role Europe played in the

process, often barely visible, an enabler, quietly creating a Europe where borders were less dividing and identity could be more fluid and multiple.

Throughout the Brexit process MEPs from Lithuania to Portugal have expressed their concern over Northern Ireland, a small part of the EU that most of them have probably never visited, German Christian Democrats. Italian Social Democrats, Belgian Greens and the European Parliament in its glorious

diversity decided to stand full-square behind the European Commission and in defence of the achievements of the imperfect but nevertheless precious Good Friday Agreement.





You're also very active as a business entrepreneur with your own production company and your 50% ownership in a lingerie company (Scandale). How big a part of your life is that now?



The one thing about France which has always appealed to me is that they have laws protecting your privacy and I think your children should be off-limits to the paparazzi. In France you have that protection.

irst of all, you have to choose the best way to go to Corsica. There is a plane from Brussels or Charleroi, or a combination of the car and boat. We opted for the latter. This seems to be the easiest way to reach the Belgodère-Palasca Club in Northern Corsica, and to keep your car for greater mobility.

After crossing France, we arrived in Nice, where we spent the night before taking the boat to Ile Rousse, which takes around five hours. And there, the west coast of Corsica appeared before us – a huge reward after this long journey! srael will host the Eurovision Song Contest on 18 May. Israel has won the competition four times, but this is the first time that the show will be held in Tel Aviv. rather than in Jerusalem. Tel Aviv is a buzzing, modern city, with a beautiful beachfront. The city, like its inhabitants, is warm, welcoming and occasionally wacky.

A-ba-ni-bi

Going through the security at Ben Gurion airport, I was eye-balled by the passport control. Where was I coming from? Brussels. Why had I flown via Georgia? What was I doing in Israel? Where was I staying? I explained that I was on a press trip to find out more about the plans for the city and the song contest. This was met with a raised

What the Telavivians really want to do is share the love of their city and Eurovision: many locals are volunteering or organizing events around the city. One thing is clear about this year's contest - it is going to be one hell of a party. So while the tickets have sold like hot cakes, there will still be a lot of fun to be had outside the "SHARE THE

Musical crossroads

Tel Aviv has many rich musical traditions. Ester Reda, an actress and singer of Ethiopian Jewish origin, says that this diversity informed her music, borrowing from Ethiopian, jazz and European influences among others. A-WA, a gutsy group of three

no-nonsense Yeminite sisters, combined their very rhythmic traditions with more contemporary hip-hop, Greek music, reggae and jazz. Already dizzy with the fusion on offer, we visited Idan Raichel, of his eponymous Project. Raichel has collaborated with artists from around the world and blends. Latin American, African and Arabic influences among others.

It's really hard to escape the love of music. On a culinary tour of the Yemenite quarter of Tel Aviv – which I would highly recommend ('Get it while it's fresh') – we stopped in a

coffee shop where a former New York cantor served Turkish coffee and then lifted a microphone to serenade us with a few numbers ranging from a traditional Jewish song to Frank Sinatra's My Way.

Bauhaus - International Style

It is worth giving a guick heads-up to the city's - sometimes neglected - architecture. 2019 marks the 100th anniversary of the foundation of the Bauhaus movement. Tel Aviv's 'White City' comprises more than 4,000 buildings designed in the Bauhaus/ International Style by German Jewish architects who immigrated to the city

Jaffa

Jaffa is Tel Aviv's older sister city, less brash than its younger sister, it is one of the oldest harbours in the world. It would be easier to list those who have not claimed the city at one time or another: the Egyptians, the Greeks, the Arabs, the Crusaders, the Ottomans ... and of course the Brits. If you have time for little else, drop into HaZaken VeHayam for lunch for traditional mezze and seafood.

Daring to Dream

The byline of the Eurovision is 'Daring to Dream'. Visiting Israel on the week of a general election it was impossible to ignore politics. Benny Gantz (Israel Resilience Party) and Bibi Netanyahu (Likud) peered down from

(LIKUd) peered down from posters – in the case of Netanyahu, shaking hands with US President Donald Trump. Netanyahu said that the Golan Heights and West Bank settlements should be recognized as Israeli territory, while Gantz was Chief of General Staff of the Israel Defence Forces during 'Operation Protective Edge' in 2014. An operation condemned by the UN Human Rights Council for inflicting a "massive degree of death and destruction in Gaza" that could amount to war crimes. The UN – may it be

added – were not silent on the Palestinian use of armed force in the same report. Either way the election result would not reflect the dreams of those living in the occupied Palestinian Territories.

Some have called on a boycott of the Eurovision, the Israeli artists we spoke to said that this was the wrong approach and urged dialogue. Raichel said people should come to the region to learn, stay a few days and visit Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, East Jerusalem, Ramallah, Gaza and nearby countries. Former laureate Izhar Cohen said he thought it was unfair to boycott; he invited people to come to Israel and see the real situation for

Het Pomphuis: An Antwerp gem

nitiated in 1918, the construction works of Het Pomphuis were finalized in 1920. The 3 massive cast-iron installations of Het Pomphuis, in its time one of the largest establishments in Europe, drained the neighbouring dry dock so a vessel could be maintained. embarked and disembarked. The shipping company Red Star Line made use of its services on a regular basis.

A loyal customer in those days was the vessel Belgenland, operating a shipping line between Antwerp and New York. The atmosphere of the vessel and the grandeur of the Art Nouveau movement are still apparent. The centrifugal pumps were able to drain the dry dock in a mere 2 hours. In 1982, Het Pomphuis was put out of service. The dry dock nr 7 has disappeared in order to facilitate the widening of the Albert canal. In 1996, it was even suggested to demolish this construction, however, the department of cultural conservation was able to prevent this and has classified the building as a monument.

The architectural style is eclectic and has acquired Art Nouveau characteristics. The inside of the building is divided into one vast space containing an impressive 7-metredeep pit. The staircases along the inner walls of the entry hall lead up to metal galleries displaying graceful iron parapets on two levels. The tall rounded arch windows are a striking feature boasting the original positioning of the metal rods.

To prevent this monument from falling into ruin, permission was given to find a new use.



After multiple propositions, the choice was for an exciting bar and restaurant. The rebuilding was concluded on 25 May 2002. After the spectacular opening, it became quite clear that Antwerp had gained a new



Books: MoonFire by Norman Mailer

This month we look at a book dealing with the single most historic event of the 20th century




n 20 July 1969, Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins met John F. Kennedy's call for a manned Moon landing by the end of the 1960s. A decade of tests and training, a staff of 400,000 engineers and scientists, a budget of billions, and the most powerful rocket ever launched all combined in an unprecedented event watched by millions the world over. And no one captured the men, the mood, and the machinery like Norman Mailer.

One of the greatest writers of the 20th century, Norman Mailer was hired by *LIFE* magazine in 1969 to cover the Moon shot.

He enhanced his reportage in the brilliantly crafted book, *Of a Fire on the Moon*, which is excerpted here. Equally adept at examining the science of space travel and the psychology of the people involved - from Saturn V rocket engineer Wernher von Braun to the crucial NASA support staff to the three astronauts - Mailer provides provocative and trenchant insights into this epoch-making event.

Illustrating this volume are hundreds of photographs and maps from the NASA vaults, magazine archives, and private collections. These images document the

development of the agency and the mission, life inside the command module and on the Moon's surface, and the world's jubilant reaction to the landing. This 50-year anniversary edition includes captions by leading Apollo 11 experts that explain the history and science behind the images, citing the mission log, publications of the day and postflight astronaut interviews; while an evocative introduction by Colum McCann celebrates Mailer's incomparable skill at transforming "the science of space... the weight of history... the breadth of mythology" into prose.

The author

Norman Mailer (1923–2007) was one of the 20th century's greatest and most influential writers, as well as one of America's most renowned and controversial literary figures. The best-selling author of a dozen novels and 20 works of nonfiction, he also wrote stage plays, screenplays, television miniseries, hundreds of essays, two books of poetry and a collection of short stories. A two-time Pulitzer Prize winner, he lived in Brooklyn, New York, and Provincetown, Massachusetts.

Colum McCann is the author of eight books, including Let the Great World Spin. He has written for The New York Times, Atlantic Monthly, GQ, The Times (London), The Irish Times, and La República.



A Street Art Trail about **Bruegel**

visit.brussels. in collaboration with the Brussels collective Farm Prod has been working on a street art trail to pay homage to the Flemish old master Pieter Bruegel right in the heart of the Belgian capital. You'll be able to see a first work by

the French artist Lazoo in the Marolles neiahbourhood. while finishing touches are being put to another on the Rue Baron Horta.

Bruegel are inextricably linked. The artist spent

After the Kunsthistorisches Museum of Vienna, the Royal Museums of Fine Arts of Belgium have the largest collection of Bruegel's paintings and the Royal Library has no less than 90 engravings.

LABIOMISTA

LABIOMISTA is a unique, evolving work of art by Koen Vanmechelen is a vigorous hybrid of art, science and society.

"LABIOMISTA is a tribute to the mix of life itself," says the artist who realised this project in

close partnership with the city of Genk. LABIOMISTA is the embodiment of Vanmechelen's art and philosophy. Internationally acclaimed for its exploration of the intersections between art, science and community, his oeuvre spans 20 years and ranges from painting and sculpture to video art, mixed-media installations and 'living art' projects. Vanmechelen is motivated by his belief in art as a catalyst for mutual understanding and as a guiding light in our search for answers to the great challenges of the 21st century – in particular - the relationship between nature and culture, and sustainable community development.



Bond In Motion

Bond in Motion is the official exhibition of James Bond vehicles that feature in the renowned film series. It is the largest display of its kind ever staged in London.

James Bond first hit the big screen in 1962, when Ian Fleming's 007 was introduced to cinema audiences around the world as the Double 0 agent in Dr No. Half a century and six Bonds later, the franchise is now one of the longest running in cinema history.

In the main exhibition space the numerous vehicles on display include the archetypal Bond car. the Aston Martin DB5. Goldfinger's majestic Rolls-Royce Phantom III and the unforgettable Lotus Esprit S1 submersible from The Spy Who Loved Me. Displayed alongside less predictable 007 modes of transport such as the Citroën 2CV and the Crocodile Submarine the exhibit also includes a variety of aircraft, boats and motorcycles.

These creative action vehicles play a pivotal role in all 24 movies and continue to propel James Bond to the cutting-edge of cinematic espionage. There are no replicas

- every vehicle exhibited is an original used for filming. The majority are loaned from the archive of EON Productions who produce the movies and the lan Fleming Foundation who have located and restored many of the vehicles.

The upper mezzanine features several examples of the creative process of the production company's art department never-before-seen concept art and storyboards. Original items on display from the James Bond film series include concept drawings, storyboards, scripts, model miniatures and full-size cars, boats, and motorbikes. Highlights include the Aston Martin DB10 from Spectre, the Aston Martin DB5 from GoldenEye; the 'Wet Nellie' Lotus Esprit S1 from The Spy Who Loved Me; the Rolls-Royce Phantom III from Goldfinger: and the 'Little Nellie' Wallis WA-116 Agile Autogyro from You Only Live Twice.

Brussels' leading film critic **James Drew** looks ahead to films that will adorn the cinema screens in Belgium



Captive State

Intriguing sci-fi thriller from the States, directed by Rupert Wyatt (Rise of the Planet of the Apes (2011)) - in 2019, Chicago is placed under martial law when extraterrestrials invade across the globe. The Drummond family is attempting to flee the city but every exit is barricaded. After breaking through an unmanned barricade, the car stops inside a tunnel where extraterrestrials are waiting at the other end. Before they can reverse, the aliens attack, vaporizing the father and mother in the front but leaving their two sons alive in the backseats. We cut to nine years later, and the human race has capitulated to the aliens... 109 min.

Third Act

Heartwarming documentary film directed by Lotte Stoops (*Grande Hotel* (2010)) and Mieke Struyve (*De paardenkoers* (2005)) about the third act which comes to many of us – ageing. *Third Act* tells the story of Leo, who is 80 years old and tours the world with the internationally renowned dance-theatre company Peeping Tom. On stage Leo is condemned to an elderly home crowded by local extras in their third age. But in real life, his wife waits for him – in an elderly home in Belgium. What do you do in the third and last act of your life? And what do the elderly in other countries and cultures do when the curtain is about to fall? *79 mins*.

Tel Aviv On Fire

Salam (Kais Nashif), a charming 30-year-old Palestinian living in Jerusalem, works as an intern on the popular Palestinian soap opera *Tel Aviv on Fire*, produced in Ramallah. He meets the commander of the check point, Assi, whose wife is a huge fan of the show. In order to impress her, Assi gets involved in the writing of the show. Salam soon realizes that Assi's ideas could get him a promotion as a screenwriter, but, squeezed between an Army officer and the Arab backers, Salam can only solve his problems with a final master stroke. Sameh Zoabi (*Under the Same Sun* (2013)) directs with aplomb.

Godzilla: King of the Monsters

We are back for the 35th (count them) installment in the *Godzilla* franchise, following the heroic efforts of the cryptozoological agency Monarch as its members face off against a battery of god-sized monsters, including the mighty Godzilla, who collides with Mothra, Rodan, and his ultimate nemesis, the three-headed King Ghidorah. When these ancient super-species - thought to be mere myths - rise again, they all vie for supremacy, leaving humanity's very existence hanging in the balance. Michael Dougherty (*Krampus* (2015)) is in charge of the monster.




